**Motions from the Retiring Committee:**

**Motion 1 – Membership fees:**

The committee propose that the 2023/2024 membership fees are increased by £5 across the board for all membership categories except for Junior memberships which will remain at the current levels. Joint memberships will increase by £10. The reasons for this proposed increase are:

- There have been no increases for 5 years
- Club expenses are increasing, e.g. rents, electricity
- Enables the club to continue investing in facilities and assets, e.g. storage container at Luckfield Lake, work tools/equipment, fish stocking and water quality improvements

All bar 1 vote were in favour of the increase with no abstentions, the motion was duly carried.

**NOTE:** The membership application form (MAF) for next season will be available in May. Once everything (forms and Clubmate) is in place and ready to go we will send out a communication to all members.

**Motion 2 – Part Year Memberships:**

The committee propose that the Half Year memberships shall cease. The reasons for this proposal are:

- The monetary difference between full year and PY is becoming negligible.
- Encourage previous PY members to visit our other waters by having to join for a full year
- Reduces work for the Membership Secretary in the autumn/winter months
- HY members actually get 7 months membership as it starts on 1st November to coincide with the opening of the Grayling season on the River Frome.
- No other club, that we are aware of, has a PY membership.

All bar 1 vote were in favour of this change with no abstentions, the motion was duly carried.

### **Treasurers Report (Jerry Bracey):**

We end the financial year with a smaller but still healthy £16,230.82 in our D.D.A.S. Account.

It has been an expensive year with our main costs being the building of new swims at Silverlakes, the netting of Heath Lake, a new water pump, a storage container at Luckfield and the purchase of 10,000 F1's for Silverlake it means we have made a loss this year of £1,064.01 with a total expenditure of £28,270.32 and income of £27,206.31.

Our membership subscription is our main source of income at £22, 249.21 although we did receive a grant of £2,400.00 from the Environmental Agency (E.A.). With other such grants being applied for in the coming year from both the E.A. and Angling Trust.

Rent is our biggest outgoing at £9,245.07. With inflation at 10% we will do our best to negotiate new deals as keenly as possible. Silverlakes have already agreed to freeze their rent for the next 5 years, we just hope our other landlords are as understanding.

Unfortunately our electricity deal with British Gas ended last month. Their initial quote was 9 times higher than we had previously been paying, but by comparing other tariffs and hanging on until the prices came down our new tariff is only around 2.5 times higher than before.

Although our membership fees have been frozen for the last few years the increases in our expenditure I have mentioned above has meant we have had to raise our fees this year to help balance our rising costs but also so we are in a position to improve our facilities and increase our fish stock.

Kind hearted members donated £460.00 this year that we have rounded up to £500.00 to present to the charity Mosaic.

We donated 2 lots to the Angling Trust for their annual auction in the shape of an annual membership and two 5 day passes for fishing on the River Frome. They raised £70 and £710 respectively, which I hope they remember when they are giving their grants out.

From my point of view when I took over this role I automatically worked on the financial year of April to March, partly due to the delay in the bank getting the paperwork finalised during Covid. For the coming and subsequent years I will revert to March until the end of February so next year's report will be based on the next eleven months only.

### **Membership Sec Report (Paul "Whisky" Haigh):**

The club membership is now at 602 plus an additional 32 exchange tickets with other clubs. The exchange tickets are with:

- 6 Tickets - Gillingham & District, Blandford & District, Frome Valley and Sturminster & Hinton
- 4 Tickets – Glaston Manor, Ilminster & District

We did have talks about an exchange ticket with Wareham AC, but they refused our offer.

Our local tackle shops did a sterling job of selling DDAS memberships, 109 in total nearly 20%, and many thanks to them all for doing so.

The exchange tickets are available via the Clubmate system and no longer in the tackle shops. There is also a postal option by sending your DDAS card to the Membership Secretary.

The second year of using Clubmate has worked well with far less issues. The system has proved a great asset in communicating with our members, as over 90% of them have an e-mail address. I would encourage all members to register and use the online system. If you are locked out of the system please use the "forgotten password" link. The Clubmate app can be used on your Smartphone and this has lots of club information on it, including maps to our waters and the club handbook.

We are no longer issuing a handbook to members. The club handbook is online and can be downloaded to a PC/Laptop/Phone (link below). Printing and sending out the handbook costs the club a large amount of money which we feel could be better spent elsewhere. With most people having access to the club website on their phone or PC it makes more sense to keep it there and you know that it always be the latest version of the document. Having said that I am looking into whether we can make a paper version available for a fee.

### **Juniors Sec Report (Graham Howard):**

After the Covid pandemic and subsequent lockdowns, the juniors have been spending the time since trying to claw back the momentum that we had gained from the years before 2020. Sadly, the equipment we purchased with the Angling Trust grant that we were given has remained unused so far. But at least we have been able to host some school events outdoors again. Atlantic Academy joined us at Harbourbridge Lakes for an evening of fishy fun during which only one student managed to cast himself into the water. He was ok however, and his friends told me it was of no great surprise to them that he would be the one to go in. It was a remarkable feat seeing as he was only using a 3 meter whip at the time.

Organising teacher has since left the Academy and moved to All Saints since then, and I am yet to hear from him. But we are hosting two new schools this year starting next month at Luckfield. It is encouraging to see evidence of the schools opening up to outside activities again.

During the summer, we hosted our first junior run charity event at Revels for the children of Mosaic. This charity is close to me personally and I think it turned out to be a soul nourishing day for all present. I very much look forward to fishing at Revels with Mosaic again later this year. On to our own junior events now and, although numbers have fluctuated a little more than I like this year, we have seen steady attendance to most of our events. August is an unpredictable month at best and, for that reason, we have left August out of the main calendar for 2023. Instead, we will try to fit in any charity events during that time.

In 2021 we had a coaching heavy program which was not to everyone's taste. A poll showed that the majority wanted more competitive events. So, that's what we have for this year. I am always trying to find the correct balance between coaching and matches. For this reason, we now have an opt out option for those that do not want to compete and instead just want to fish. Our juniors excelled themselves and set new benchmarks to aim at for the future. The most significant of these was the pairs match at Todber which saw Faith Stone record our first ever 100lb plus event match weight. She didn't hold it for long however because Ollie Smith weighed 140lbs just three pegs later. His record was even shorter lived as Jack Copp weighed 150lbs from

the next peg. It is not just about what they caught, but how they went about it. All showing the skills it took to have some pretty reasonable weights recorded next to their name.

I have been writing the blog on our website after every event. This has been badged as an occasionally true story of real events, which has been steadily gathering new readers over the last two years. Some of what I write actually happens too. I also write more factual reports in the Dorset Echo and the West Dorset Magazine which I hope has been helping to raise our profile in the local community. Sundays are very much admin days for me.

The website has proved a good investment and provides good support and information about the juniors. The only drawback was the online booking system which is overly complicated and troublesome to use. This year which switched to a mobile App called Spond which allows parents to book into junior events with a single click and is proving to be very efficient.

This concludes the junior report for this year, and it only remains for me to thank the committee for their continued support. To say thank you to all the fisheries that support us. Revels, Whitemoor, Harbourbridge, and Todber Manor. Thank you to Jason Fricker at Revels fishery and tackle shop, and to Alan Winsper at Alan's Angling for their help and support. Thank you to all the parents for taking the time to loan us their offspring so that we might teach them to embrace a lifelong addiction to angling. Thank you to my amazingly dedicated team of coaches who freely offer their experience, sacrifice their spare time and sometimes even some of their own tackle to the cause. lastly to our juniors for making the sessions so rewarding and for being good ambassadors not only for the club, but to the future of our sport.

### **The Club Waters and a few other things .....**

**Luckfield Lake:**

The new storage unit was installed which means that some of the committee's sheds and garages are now a little less full. Fishing on this beautiful lake continues to be a favourite amongst our membership.

**Silverlake:**

Steve Sudworth gave a good presentation at the AGM about the history and building of the new lakes. A few bullet points from the presentation:

- Heath Lake netted and the fish moved to Lysander Lake
- A good number of F1's stocked in Lysander
- 16 pegs built on Lysander
- 4 pegs completed on Lucy's Pool
- Memorial bench donated by Bill Lucy's daughter install at the lakes. A large number of willow trees planted around the lakes
- EA funding paid for a great deal of the cost of the first phase of peg building
- Application made to the EA for funding for phase 2 of the peg builds
- Lakes will be open around mid April, exact dates will be communicated when finalised
- Order put in to the EA stock of Bream and Tench for delivery in early 2024
- Initial stocking of Carp in Lucy's Pool was done in December 2021

Post AGM: The lakes will be open to club members from Monday 17<sup>th</sup> April 2023

**Potwell:**

Nothing to report this year other than this is a great place to fish while enjoying the surrounding countryside and wildlife. There is a good stock of Roach, small Bream there and Carp mostly in 4-8lb range, although there are some bigger ones with a 26lb Common Carp recorded in 2022.

**Revels:**

Jason continues to provide a varied complex of lakes with fishing for every type of angler. The last DDAS Christmas match was very well supported with nearly 40 anglers taking part. Jason is constantly improving the complex and runs a very good tackle shop, so if you need new gear or bait please support the tackle shop there as well as our other associated tackle shops.

**River Frome:**

Good catches reported, although not many large (3lb+) fish recorded. Flooding in the New Year restricted fishing, but overall a good winter season. The fly tipping on the track at Worgret also caused problems, but is hopefully a one off incident.

**River Stour:**

The summer drought and winter floods meant restricted fishing on the Stour this season. We are actively trying to discuss access and work party issues with the land owner so that we can improve the fishing on our stretches of the river, but this has not been easy.

**Sharnhill Upper Lake:**

A lot of "gardening" work and improvements to the inlet pipe and out flow pipe have improved the water levels and quality. Good catches reported on most days although a senior match held there had some very good match anglers recording blanks!

**Kingcombe:**

We are aware of the issues with weed on Lodge Lake, it's an annual problem that will never be completely resolved, and the lack of silver fish. The owner has restocked the lake this winter so hopefully we will see improvements in catches this spring.

**Feedback:**

The committee would ask that our members provide some feedback on how our waters are performing, good or bad, any special catches (see also the Specimen Badge/Cup section of the handbook), any issues with access or land management especially on some of the lesser fished waters. Your comments can be given in a variety of ways, Facebook, e-mail, post, a phone call, Facebook Messenger. Whatever platform you use the feedback will help us in managing the club and its waters in the future.

There is also a copy on the Clubmate app if you are registered on the system and have the app on your Smartphone.

### **Specimen Cup:**

Sadly there were no entries for the Specimen Cup this year and therefore no entries for a Specimen Badge. It would be good if members entered more of their "special catches" in this category. Details of how to do so are on the club website and handbook


